2.1 Presentation by the County of Simcoe concerning Bridge Housing Program Update

Mina Fayez-Bahgat, General Manager of Social and Community Services, Andrew Scavarelli, Director of Housing and Homelessness Services, and Kate Hunter, Manager of Homelessness Services of the County of Simcoe provided a presentation concerning the Bridge Housing Program Update located at 113 Tiffin Street.

Mr. Fayez-Bahgat, Mr. Scavarelli, and Ms. Hunter discussed slides concerning the following topics:

- The purpose and role of Bridge Housing
- Quick facts about Bridge Housing;
- The operators and community partners involved in the Bridge Housing project; and
- The community engagement undertaken and next steps.

Mr. Handy described the location of the property, including farmstead, farm yard, farmhouse, stable, and outbuildings. He discussed his concerns related to the proposed amendment designating the majority of the farm as Environmental Protection Act (EPA). Mr. Handy objected to the EPA designation of the property.
